

JOBS: More People Are Working Than at Any Point in American History

Signed American Rescue Plan which led to fastest job recovery in history

Made more than 4 million federal workers eligible for overtime pay

Banned noncompete agreements for workers

Two strongest years of job growth in history

Nearly 11 million jobs created since 2021

750,000 new manufacturing jobs, Created more manufacturing jobs in 2022 than in any single year in nearly 30 years

3.5% unemployment rate — the lowest in 50 years & 17 states have unemployment below 3%

Near a record low unemployment rate for Hispanics

Near a record low unemployment rate for African-Americans

Record low unemployment rate for people with disabilities

Thanks to Investing in America Agenda, Microsoft data center and 2,000 new jobs are coming to Racine, Wisconsin

The CHIPS and Science Act will boost American semiconductor research, development, and production, ensuring U.S. leadership in the technology that forms the foundation of everything from automobiles to household appliances to defense systems. HEALTH: More People Have Health Insurance and Lower Medical Cost

Historically low Uninsured Rate of 8%

4 out of 5 people can find coverage on Healthcare.gov for \$10 a month or less

Millions of Americans are saving \$800 per year on health insurance coverage

Over 16M people Enrolled in ACA, highest number ever

Fully vaccinated 79% of American adults against COVID-19

Mailed over 740 million free COVID-19 tests directly to tens of millions of Americans

Led the world in a historic release of strategic reserves

Reignited the Cancer Moonshot with the goal of cutting the cancer death rate by at least half over the next 25 years

Lowered the cost of hearing aids by making them available over the counter

Advanced cutting-edge research on cancer and other diseases through the ARPA-H initiative

Hosted the first White House Conference on Hunger, Nutrition, and Health in over 50 years and released a National Strategy to end hunger and reduce diet-related diseases and disparities by 2030

Through PACT Act for Veterans, VA health care and benefits for Veterans exposed to burn pits, Agent Orange, and other toxic substances is expanded

Lowered seniors' health care expenses, including by capping out of pocket expenses on prescription drugs for seniors at \$2,000 per year, ensuring that people enrolled in Medicare will not IRANIAN AMERICAN DEMOCRATS pay more than \$35 for a month's supply of insulin, and CALIFOR recipients will receive free vaccines

STUDENTS: Debt Forgiveness Helps Narrow Wealth Gap

40 million borrowers stand to benefit from student debt relief

Biden-Harris Administration has cancelled nearly \$160 billion in student loan, no individual or household in the top 5% of income will benefit

20 Million borrowers have their loans fully canceled

Increased the maximum value of Pell Grants by \$900

Fixed the Public Service Loan Forgiveness Program

EDUCATION: Delivering for Educators

The American Rescue Plan Act of 2021 includes just over \$170.3 billion for schools, making this the federal government's largest-ever single education investment

Historic funding for Historically Black Colleges and Universities (HBCUs), delivered a historic \$5.8 billion cumulative investment in and support for HBCUs, including: American Rescue Plan. President Biden's American Rescue Plan and other pandemic relief has provided

nearly \$3.7 billion in relief funding to HBCUs this year alone

Supported the biggest three-year gain in education jobs since the mid-1970s and working to address the educator shortage

Secured \$1 billion to hire school mental health professionals, provide support for children and families struggling with gun violence trauma, and more

Canceling educator's student loan debt

Enabling teachers to collectively bargain for higher pay and better working conditions

Fighting to cut educators' taxes





VOTING RIGHTS: Making Voting Accessible for All Americans

Signed the Electoral Count Act, which takes long overdue steps to protect the integrity of our elections

<u>Department of Education</u>: Access to voter registration services made easy for postsecondary students by linking vote.gov and StudentAid.gov

The <u>Department of Agriculture (USDA)</u> enhanced efforts to promote access to voting by encouraging all USDA agency field offices to make nonpartisan information about voter registration available in customer service locations

The <u>Indian Health Service (IHS)</u> promotes access to voting in Indian Country by piloting high-quality voter registration services to patients across five IHS facilities

Vote.gov is now accessible in twelve languages, with more translations coming online soon, and GSA will continue working to enhance the website to make it easier for Americans to register to vote and obtain nonpartisan information about voting.

Supporting the third-party Volunteer Income Tax Assistance (VITA) partners in offering voter registration services to individuals who seek tax assistance, <u>Treasury</u> is now providing information about voter registration in the instructions for IRS Form 1040 and in direct mail pieces delivered to approximately 900,000 Americans who receive Social Security Benefits, Railroad Pension benefits, and federal retirement benefits

<u>General Services Administration</u>: Voter registration information and additional resources for newly naturalized Americans are available on the USCIS website for New U.S. Citizens

In 2023, the <u>Department of the Interior</u> became the first agency to be designated as voter registration agency when two Bureau of Indian Education-operated postsecondary institutions—Haskell Indian Nations University in Kansas and the Southwestern Indian Polytechnic Institute in New Mexico—formed partnerships with state election authorities to provide the opportunity to register to vote.

The <u>Department of Justice</u> has developed a program to educate individuals about their voting rights, specific to each state and territory. The Department is also promoting access to voting for those who remain eligible to vote while in federal custody, including by putting in place procedures to facilitate voter registration and voting.

<u>Department of Defense</u>: The Federal Voting Assistance Program, which works to ensure Service members and overseas citizens have access to voting, has made the Federal Post Card Application (FPCA) for voter registration or ballot request and the Federal Write-in Absentee Ballot (FWAB) available in seven languages.

<u>Department of State</u>: Travel.state.gov now reflects up-to-date information on absentee voting and registration for U.S. citizens abroad

LOWERING HOUSEHOLD COST: Reduce Families' Everyday Expenses Through the Inflation Reduction Act (IRA)

Over 16 million households receiving lower cost or free highspeed internet through the Affordable Connectivity Program with commitment from 20 providers

Taken over 100 actions to lower household energy costs by \$100 per year

Helped bring gas prices down more than \$1.60 from their summer 2022 peak

Investing in America Agenda lowers water bills

Lowered bank fees, only \$8 for overdraft fees (\$8 late fee for credit cards has been halted by a judge in Texas)

Millions of Americans are saving \$800 per year on health insurance coverage

\$500 in annual savings for Americans through clean energy tax credit programs

\$2000 annual cap on out-of-pocket prescription drug costs for seniors

Require refunds for consumers for flight delays or cancellations

\$0 tax increase for families earning less than \$400K per year

Fully funded WIC to feed women and children

\$1 billion increase in funding for child care and pre-k, ensuring families making up to \$200K don't pay more than \$10 a day for childcare



ECONOMY: Focus on Making Tax Code Fairer and Reduce deficit

Awarded the most ever federal contracting dollars to small businesses and disadvantaged small businesses

15% minimum tax on billion dollars corporations

1% surcharge on corporate stick buybacks

Lowered the deficit with the single largest annual reduction in American history

Though the Inflation Reeducation Act (IRA) of 2022, providing \$80 billion in funding for IRS in order to reduce tax gap collecting over \$600 billion in back taxes from millionaires and tax dodgers - which will reduce deficit by nearly one-quarter. It also creates 30,000 new jobs in order to be fully staffed

SAFETY: Protecting the Safety of All Americans

Signed Bipartisan Safer Communities Act, the most significant gun violence prevention legislation in nearly 30 years

The legislation is already saving lives by keeping guns out of the hands of individuals under 21 who are prohibited from purchasing firearms, empowering the Justice Department with new authorities to prosecute firearms traffickers, improving access to mental health services in our schools to help young people deal with the trauma and grief resulting from gun violence, and investing in community violence interventions.

Fighting to ban assault weapons and high-capacity magazines and require universal background checks

Signed an Executive Order on Improving Public Safety and Criminal Justice for Native Americans and Addressing the Crisis of Missing and Murdered Indigenous People

Established first-ever White House Office of Gun Violence Prevention



WOMEN: Supporting Women & Protecting Reproductive Rights by Executive Orders

Signed legislation to reauthorize and strengthen the Violence Against Women Act

Signed legislation that provides new protections for pregnant and postpartum workers

Supports the right to travel across state lines for medical care

Protects access to reproductive healthcare, including abortion, during medical emergencies

Protects patient privacy & sensitive health Information

Established the White House Gender Policy Council

Established the first-ever White House Initiative on Women's Health Research

Invested \$12 billion into women's health research

First women vice president and record number of cabinet secretaries

Nominated the most diverse set of judges to the federal bench and appointed first African American women to Supreme court, Honorable Ketanji Brown Jackson

Invested in women entrepreneurs and small business owners

Lowest unemployment rate among women in 70 years



MINORITIES: Historic Steps to Advance Full Equality for LGBTQIA & Other Minorities

Signed Respect for Marriage Act, protecting millions of same-sex and interracial couples

Full equity for LGBTQI+ Americans by reversing the discriminatory ban on transgender service members

Strengthening non-discrimination protections in health care, housing, education, and employment

Ensured transgender Americans can access government support and services

Invested historic funding for Tribal governments and Native communities

Committed to preserving DACA and expanding opportunities for Dreamers

Expanded quality affordable care access to DACA recipients, with 100 thousands young people are now eligible for ACA

Established "Welcome Corps" a refugee sponsorship initiative under the U.S. Refugee Admissions Program (USRAP). Through the Welcome Corps, Americans, in groups of at least 5 adults, support newly arrived refugees by securing and preparing initial housing, greeting them at the airport, enrolling children in school, helping adults find employment and meet other needs to ensure they are prepared for life in the United States.



INFRASTRACTURE: Rebuilding and Investing in Air, Water, Roads, Internet

Infrastructure investments in all 50 states, D.C., territories, and throughout Tribal nations

Creates good paying jobs in every part of the country

Builds first ever national network of EV charging stations

Largest investment in rebuilding our roads and bridges since the Interstate Highway System - including \$40 billion for bridges alone

Largest investment in public transit in American History - \$108 billion for public transportation

Largest investment in tackling legacy pollution - overall \$660 million in formula grant funding being released on a rolling basis. \$54.2 million from Investing in America agenda for North Dakota and West Virginia to plug approx. 200 orphaned oil and gas wells

\$20 billion in water infrastructure investments from the American Rescue Plan

\$13 billion to improve wastewater, sanitation, and stormwater infrastructure

Ensures access to clean drinking water in every community, enacted first-ever national drinking water limits on PFAS chemicals

Investing \$3 billion in replacing toxic lead pipes in every state

Advancing President's Lead Pipe and Paint Action Plan, nearly \$90 million funding available through the Department of Housing to reduce health hazards in public housing

\$65 billion to ensure every American has access to affordable, reliable high-speed internet through a historic investment in broadband infrastructure deployment.

DEMOCRATS

Building a more resilient power grid and scales new clean energy technologies, upgrading 100,000 miles of power line



ENVIRONMENT: Most Aggressive Climate Action in American History

The Inflation Reduction Act, has created 271,713 new clean energy jobs and unleashed \$352 billion in investments

Rejoined the Paris Agreement on day one to reassert the United States global leadership to combat the climate crisis

America is now positioned to achieve its climate goals of cutting our emissions in half by 2030 (40% below 2005 levels) and net-zero by 2050

Established the American Climate Corps, nearly 50 thousand young people will be trained in clean energy conservation and climate resilience skills

Protected more lands and waters than any President since J.F.K (over 26M acres)

Investing in clean and equitable solutions in disadvantaged communities

Canceled remaining oil and gas leases in the Arctic National Wildlife Refuge

Established \$7 billion in grants to fund cost-saving solar energy for low-income communities

Initiated new training programs for manufacturing workers and clean energy jobs





ENVIRONMENT: Most Aggressive Climate Action in American History

Jump started the American offshore wind industry and convened the nation's first federal-state offshore wind partnership, enough to power 4 million homes

Awarded more than \$1 billion to initiate cleanup and clear the backlog of 49 previously unfunded Superfund sites, over \$250 million to clean up hundreds of contaminated brownfield sites and \$725 million for abandoned mine lands

Restored protections for Bears Ears, Grand Staircase-Escalante, and Northeast Canyons and Seamounts National Monuments and designated Camp Hale-Continental Divide National Monument to conserve our lands and waters, honor our nation's veterans, protect Tribal cultural resources, and support jobs and America's outdoor recreation economy

Accelerated adoption of electric vehicles by reducing costs for families, jumpstarted the first national EV charging network, and made historic investments into EV

batteries and materials

Set new policies to reduce super pollutants like HFCs, paused new methane gas (LNG) export terminals to protect communities and reduce emissions fueling climate change

Supercharged U.S. clean energy manufacturing





FOREIGN POLICY: Biden's Wins Have Been Overshadowed by Images Resulting from Funding of Wars, Loss of Lives and Chaotic Withdrawal from Afghanistan

Strengthened and Expanded the NATO alliances (Sweden & Finland)

Biden has stood firmly against the world's two leading autocrats, Chinese President Xi Jinping and Russian President Vladimir Putin.

Successfully created a robust trans-Atlantic and trans-Pacific coalition to support Ukraine and sanction Russia

Indo-Pacific has been a priority, the State Department and Pentagon have spent considerable time bringing East Asian allies onside and even brokered an entente of sorts between Japan and South Korea

Delivering on what it calls its "invest, align, and compete" strategy toward China, including by channeling billions of dollars into U.S. semiconductor manufacturing and science research, retaining most of former U.S. President Donald Trump's restrictions on China, and going a significant step further by restricting semiconductor exports in an attempt to thwart China's development of high technology

Raised tariffs on clean-energy goods from China in May 2024, with the levy on Chinese electric vehicles set to roughly quadruple

Strategic ambiguity has been replaced by strategic clarity, repeatedly committing the U.S. to helping Taiwan if China were to invade

Two positive decisions he made early in his term: sending a comprehensive immigration reform bill to the U.S. Congress (it went nowhere, but at least he made the effort) and eliminating the Trump administration's most odious policies, including family separation and the requirement for asylum-seekers to remain in Mexico while their cases are reviewed.





FOREIGN POLICY: Biden's Wins Have Been Overshadowed by Images Resulting from Funding of Wars, Loss of Lives and Chaotic Withdrawal from Afghanistan

5 American detainees were allowed to leave Iran in exchange for Tehran gaining access to \$6 billion in oil revenue that South Korea owed Iran, but funds are kept in the central bank of Qatar and were to be used for humanitarian purposes only. five Iranians who had either been charged or convicted in the U.S. received clemency.

The U.S. and Qatar agreed to freeze \$6 billion in Iranian assets after October 7th attack in Israel.

Through 88 sanction announcements since January 2021, the Biden Administration has imposed sanction on many Iranian individuals, businesses and trading partners

Signed 6 punitive laws against Iran •as part of the national security supplemental package: MAHSA Act, SHIP Act, Holding Iranian leaders Accountable Act, Iran china Energy Sanction Act, Fight and Combat Iranian Missile Exports, No Technology for Terror Act

Maintained IRGC on the List of Terrorists Organizations

Ended the 20-year war in Afghanistan based on the agreement that Trump had signed with Taliban; brought many allies and their families to safety

Eliminated the Al-Qaeda leader Ayman al-Zawahiri and the brokered a long-awaited Israel-Lebanon maritime border deal.
